

A New Song

A quick recap from last month. It is based on Joshua 10:1-43 as our launching pad for the qualities of a God-ordained leader.

A leader must have a personal relationship with God. They know who God is in all of His infinite sovereignty and wisdom. There is evidence of maturation in Christ Jesus. A godly leader surrenders his will in obedience-Here I am LORD...use me (1 Samuel 3:6)! A leader of success presents God's vision for fulfillment of God's purposes. Righteous leaders squelch "sin" by knowing God. They permit His light within them to dispel the darkness without procrastination (Matthew 5:14). A leader who walks in faith, in obedience to God, is priceless. (1 Samuel 15:22) Obedience sets the pace for an extraordinary leader (Joshua 5:13-15).

What are the attributes of a faithful leader? Joshua's life had three distinct time frames. First, forty years in Egypt. Second, forty years in the wilderness. Finally, thirty years in Canaan. His transition proved him to be trustworthy to become the leader of Israel as a nation. Joshua did not live in the realm of his ten brothers refusing to advance into the Promised Land. He was a visionary ahead of the time. Joshua knew how to climb above the circumstances when each and every challenge appeared on the horizon. Joshua embraced all responsibilities linked with the challenge. As God led, coupled by Joshua's obedience, Joshua went ahead and "did it".

When calamities arose, Joshua lived a more exemplary, more intensified style of commanding and leading the Israelites back on the right path. Achan was defiant. Achan lost. Achan died. God moved forward with Joshua and the Israelites with future victories. Joshua was an overcomer of calamities (Romans 8:37). Joshua did not worship his gifts, instead he worshipped and honored God. Joshua did not see giants. He saw milk and honey in the land. Joshua was goal oriented based on God's directives. He was not satisfied with status quo. He chose to soar above and beyond.

What are some additional qualities of a godly leader?

- a. The leader has the roar of the Lion of Judah and the compassion of the passover Lamb
- b. He knows the significance of being still (Romans 46:10); when it is time for Nay or Amen "so be it"; and when to take the kingdom by force (Matthew 11:12).
- c. He can realistically exhort, encourage in the good and bad times.
- d. Faith is having confidence in God and His Word to seize God's gift of empowerment, linked to the anointing to embrace difficulties.

We are all leaders. Yes! Mark 1:17 states we are fishers of men leading others to Christ Jesus. Then, we lead by discipleship training and must uphold the Word by "walking the talk". Finally, joy in serving in the name of the Lord!

As a leader, we may encounter a storm in our life. We shall see what God's Word has to say. Please turn to Psalms 29 which speaks of God's glory in the storm. Verse 11 "The Lord gives strength to His people. The Lord blesses His people with peace". God graces us with what is truly needed the most - His strength and peace - Shalom.
