In this inspired letter that Paul wrote from prison around 2,000 years ago we can discover some the richest blessings that are ours in Christ Jesus. The editor of our material this quarter Pastor David Orlo Dykes, reminds us that... (“the Bible is still the world’s most-read book. Although it was written by over forty men spanning more than 1,600 years writing in three languages, it has one central theme: God’s loving redemption of fallen humanity”). This theme is reflected in Ephesians. I pray that you will be greatly blessed as we study Ephesians through the thirteen weeks of this Fall Quarter.

As you know I really like to use the words “Ponder” and “Invite.” Sooo I humbly ask you to PONDER whether The Lord might be leading you to become a teacher of His Holy Word as a Sunday school teacher.
